Western Ave from 155<sup>th</sup> Street to 190<sup>th</sup> Street  
200<sup>th</sup> Ave from 155<sup>th</sup> Street to 190<sup>th</sup> Street  
215<sup>th</sup> Ave from 155<sup>th</sup> Street to 170<sup>th</sup> Street  
J-18/120<sup>th</sup> Street from the Town of Randolph to L-63/301<sup>th</sup> Ave  
L-63/310<sup>th</sup> Ave from 120<sup>th</sup> Street to 140<sup>th</sup> Street  
307<sup>th</sup> Ave from 140<sup>th</sup> Street to J-26/170<sup>th</sup> Street  
L-68/330<sup>th</sup> Ave from J-18/120<sup>th</sup> Street to J-46/250<sup>th</sup> Street

J-64/310<sup>th</sup> St/333 from the I-29 exit at Hamburg, east to 250<sup>th</sup> Ave  
195<sup>th</sup> Street between 390<sup>th</sup> Ave and 400<sup>th</sup> Ave  
400<sup>th</sup> Ave from 190<sup>th</sup> Street to 195<sup>th</sup> Street  
J-32/190<sup>th</sup> St from 408<sup>th</sup> Ave to the Old State Highway 2 and J-32/190<sup>th</sup> Street intersection  
Airport Road from Manti Road to the end of Airport Road

Remember, turn around, don't drown. If you encounter water over the roadway, do not drive through it. You have no idea what damage has been done to the roadway under the water or if they roadway is still there or if there is a sinkhole in it's place.

Additionally, we are advising people to stay off the levees as they are soft and wet and driving on them will damage them which in turn could cause other issues with the amount of water we have up against our levees at this time. Driving on the levees in their current state could be hazardous to your health if it would happen to collapse while you are on it.
